

Terms of Reference

Applications from emerging leaders from any of our established international partner institutions (e.g. Lao, Tanzania, Uganda, Philippines, Nicaragua, Nepal, and Ethiopia) will be accepted.

The fund would provide full or partial tuition, travel and living support for the following programs and activities:

Short intensive training opportunities for clinical faculty or research trainees to come to the Cumming School of Medicine. This opportunity could include course work, intensive supervision, clinical enhancement training or observerships. These short visits (less than 4 months) would be designed to be highly specific to individual needs under the supervision and mentorship of Cumming School of Medicine faculty.

PhD, Residency and Masters level training in the student's home country or regional academic institution.

PhD's and Masters level training in Canada.

Administration

A Steering Committee consisting of global health faculty leaders and an administrative support person in the CSM with an interest and experience in international partnerships will adjudicate all applications. Country partner representatives will be invited to work with the committee to review applications and ensure the success of the program. Aspects such as local support and release for training, logistical and administrative aspects will be negotiated with the home institution of the applicant.

Awards can vary and funding will be determined on a case by case basis. Anyone applying for a PhD level training in Canada will require partial funding from their home institution and/or their supervisor in Canada, or a scholarship. A Feasby Graduate Award in Global Health can be used to complement this funding.

Feasby scholars and their supervisors are required to submit a joint report to the committee following the completion of the program, preferably within three months.
