HOW DO YOU SOLVE PROBLEMS?

Healthcare providers are skilled problem-solvers, addressing immediate challenges to maintain uninterrupted patient care.

When you are faced with an issue, you swiftly resolve the concern and resume your tasks. This is first-order problem solving.

When you fail to address the underlying reasons, the problems will continue to happen. However, by collaborating with others to determine why these problems occur, and uncover the root causes behind these problems, you can use your expertise to share knowledge and solve problems together. This is second-order problem solving.

Leaders can work with you and the team to invest the time to develop lasting solutions to problems.

Problem Solving in the Real World:

- First order: Stockpiling or borrowing supplies from another unit when there isn't enough supplies to complete a task.
- Second order: Working with unit managers and Contracting, Procurement & Supply Management (CPSM) to change the minimum stock levels on supply carts, so needed supplies are available.
