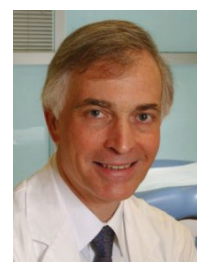
Conference partners also include Alberta Health Services and the University of Calgary.
