

## QuICR web site launched QuICR is an Alberta-wide stroke program that gims to improve

program that aims to improve stroke outcomes through rapid clinical and neurovascular imaging evaluation, combined with fast treatment. They are focussed on acute stroke (first 12 hours) and acute TIA/minor stroke (first 24 hours).

There are three main components to the program:

 A clinical and imaging stroke registry that captures all acute stroke and TIA/minor stroke in Alberta;

- Province-wide quality improvement and knowledge translation process focusing on access to care and speed of treatment; and
- Various clinical research projects that lead to new clinical innovation towards the main foci of this program.
