FINDINGS FROM A WORLD CAFÉ TO GAIN COMMUNITY GROUP PERSPECTIVES

Advance Care Planning is a process for communicating a person's future healthcare preferences and medical decision-making. It is a key part of achieving person and family-centred healthcare.

The World Café method gathers dialogue on "questions that matter" by creating a welcoming 'cafe' environment, where participants, in small groups, ponder and discuss the questions together.

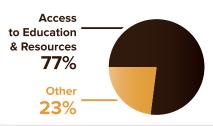

How we analyzed the data:

Written comments aligning with each World Café question were coded and themed into categories.

Just under 800 written comments in total were analyzed.



The majority of comments expressed a need for education and resources.



Recommendations to increase Albertans' awareness of and participation in Advance Care Planning.



Make Advance Care Planning resources easily accessible to community groups



Provide education and facilitation opportunities for community groups, healthcare providers, and business professionals



Simplify healthcare system processes and increase support for conversations



Use stories/make use of personal experiences



Increase marketing of Advance Care Planning to the public



Capitalize on opportunities to integrate Advance Care Planning into major life events



Include business partners in Advance Care Planning (e.g. legal, financial, insurance)



Standardize Advance Care Planning terminology across the country
