Dr. Jeffrey Kline received his MD from the Medical College of Virginia, and then did an emergency medicine residency followed by a research fellowship the Carolinas Medical Center. He now serves as Vice Chair of Research in emergency medicine and a professor of physiology at Indiana University School of Medicine. He is the present Editor In Chief of Academic Emergency Medicine. His research interest focuses on blood clots, the people who have them, and the people who diagnose and treat them. In the area of diagnosis, Kline's main interests are in intuitive decision making, pretest probability to reduce medical imaging. He is the cofounder of Indiana Lysis Technologies LLC, a company that seeks to translate nanoparticle-delivered plasmin for clot lysis into clinical use.
