Calgary Zone Direct Referral Communication Reminder

Just a reminder that when you are transferring a patient between Calgary Zone EDs as a **Direct Referral** (and you have already spoken with the Consulting service), please contact the RAAPID-designated ED MD at the receiving site through the unit clerk at the receiving site. **Do not use RAAPID for this.**

Communication between ED MDs however is a critical safety mechanism for these patients and we ask that you connect with the receiving MD although it takes some additional time.

UNC Change Memo

Criteria for the Urgent Neurology Clinic (UNC) have been updated. See the memo here. Please make sure that your referral meets UNC criteria; if in doubt, speak to on-call neurology. Neurology leadership have also identified that the wait time to see a neurologist in the "general neurology clinic" has gone down (to four weeks!). They feel that referrals for non-urgent matters should be made through the patient's Family Practitioner.
