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COVID-19 Updates

Admitting Well Patients for Isolation

There are current outbreaks at many of the facilities that traditionally house vulnerable patients with unstable housing. Occasionally the MOH will direct a patient to be admitted to hospital for isolation when they are at risk for increasing spread of COVID-19 and have no place to isolate.

Bottom line:

Only the following categories of well patients should be considered for admission to a hospital bed purely for isolation purposes. In case of disagreement or confusion, please consult the MOH on call. It is possible (desirable) that the criteria for admission might be tightened if capacity becomes tight(er).

- COVID positive
- COVID pending but symptomatic and a close contacts of a positive case
- asymptomatic close contacts WHO HAVE EXTENSIVE MEDICAL NEEDS RELATED TO ADDICTIONS

Please see the full background document here; it is worth reading as it outlines how patients are categorized into Priorities, how isolation facilities are categorized into Tiers, and how MOH's designate which priority patients to which Tier of isolation facility.

Note: If the patient is at an urgent care facility, the Urgent Care MD can arrange for admission to the ward (or to the ED if the ward is full) by direct consultation with the hospitalist via RAAPID. This protocol is outlined here.

Reminder about entering the admit order when transferring a patient between EDs

If you are transferring a patient from an ED to be admitted at another site (ie. Urology at RVGH), an admission order must be entered in SEC. This is generally the responsibility of the accepting specialist, but if they happen to be somewhere where they do not have immediate access to SEC, they may ask you to do it.

Topic: Disruption, Danger, Droperidol: "Management of Agitation in the Emergency Department"

Agitation poses a direct threat to the safety of both patient and staff, as well as being an important manifestation of dangerous conditions that require rapid identification and treatment. Management of agitation consists primarily of physical and chemical restraint, and the details of how restraint is carried out—usually based more on tradition than considered plans or thoughtful protocols—directly determine case outcome. In this talk, we'll discuss the initial approach to agitation, focusing on the appropriate role of physical restraint, and then deliberate the options for chemical sedation and propose a menu of the safest and most effective agents for a variety of common agitation scenarios.

Global EM Update - Global Rounds Dec 3, 2020.

Please save the date! Emergency physician and renowned author James Maskalyk will be giving us the annual **Global Emergency Medicine Grand Rounds Thursday**, **December 3**. This will be of particular interest to those in the global EM and wellness hubs.

Title: Doctor: Heal Thyself

Topic: Using his decades of experience as a humanitarian physician, Dr. Maskalyk will draw parallels between the COVID-19 pandemic, the ongoing health crises that preceded it, and the necessity of "healing on the fly" when confronting them. He will also discuss his recent experience of illness, and how it illuminated his role as physician. Finally, he will leave us with two self-care practices to help us our life in the emergency department, and outside of it.

Biography: James Maskalyk is a physician and author, both of the international bestseller "Six Months in Sudan" and more recently, "Life on the Ground Floor ", which won Canada's largest non-fiction literary prize. He is an award-winning teacher and associate professor at the University of Toronto and practices emergency medicine and trauma at St. Michael's, Toronto's inner-city hospital, where he was the inaugural "wellness" lead in 2018.

He is the strategic director of a <u>program</u> that works with Ethiopian partners at Addis Ababa University to train East Africa's first emergency physicians and is a member of Medecins Sans Frontieres, an organization for which he has worked as journalist and physician. His work has appeared in newspapers around the world, and he wrote a <u>diary</u> for the Globe and Mail during the early days of COVID-19, and is writing his third book for Penguin Random House, titled "Doctor: Heal Thyself" about moving beyond traditional views of the body to explore different types of healing.
