Medical Director Advanced Technical Skills Simulation Laboratory

The ATSSL is a state-of-the-art facility that allows medical trainees and practicing professionals the opportunity to acquire, practice and develop their skills in a safe learning environment. The facility opened in 2014, and offers a full complement of simulation modalities from human and cadaveric tissue procedural skills to theater-based simulation for all learners in pre-licensure and licensed health professional education in the University of Calgary (UCalgary) and Alberta Health Services (AHS). This includes medical students, postgraduate medical residents, practicing physicians, nursing students, nurses, and allied health professionals. In 2018, the ATSSL was granted accreditation as a Simulation Program from the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada.

Medical Director – Physician Support Services: Continuing Medical Education and Professional Development (CME&PD)

Background:

The University of Calgary, Continuing Medical Education & Professional Development (CME&PD) is fully accredited by the Committee on Accreditation of Canadian Medical Education (CACME) and is an accredited CPD provider for the College of Family Physicians of Canada (CFPC) and the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada (RCPSC). We offer a broad range of evidence-based learning opportunities to physicians, other health professionals and the public in a variety of formats from face-to-face, online and blended learning. The support we provide includes accreditation consultation, professional course design, event planning and management, and physician remediation services.

Medical Director, Physician Support Services reports to the Associate Dean, CME&PD and works closely with the Assistant Dean, Personalized Learning. Two major activities the incumbent will support are: 1) Alberta Physician Assessment & Support Services (APASS) program, and 2) developing a Peer Coaching for Practicing Professionals program. APASS provides educational support and assessment of physicians referred through the College of Physicians & Surgeons of Alberta (CPSA). The program operates at arm's length from the CPSA and does not make decisions regarding fitness to practice or licensure as these determinations are the exclusive purview of the CPSA.

APASS and Peer Coaching is premised upon directly observed learning experiences in the clinical setting and/or practice-data informed learning needs with recommendations to participate in other learning programs/courses, directed reading, or standardized patient experiences. In additional APASS will match physicians with experienced clinical preceptors and assessors and includes the provision of detailed suggestions for remediation, including resources to address the deficits. **Responsibilities:**

- The Medical Director, Physician Support Services will work under independent direction to:
- Contribute to Peer Coaching for Practicing Professionals in development of framework and strategies to advance Physician Practice Improvement
- Develop Focused Learning Plans and monitor progress of APASS referees
- Identify, recruit and develop clinical preceptors and assessors
- Identify risks, troubleshoot and provide input to the Assistant Dean and Associate Dean
- Guide development and delivery of CPD activities to support both physicians within APASS and those participating in practice improvement; with special reference to quality learning objectives, educational design, and conflict of interest management
- Collaborate with internal and external academic, clinical, regulatory and professional bodies to facilitate shared activities and resources in order to meet the needs of the APASS objectives

- Liaise with CPSA and CME leadership to ensure highest standards are met for accredited learning activities
- Participate in the creation and dissemination of scholarship around best practices in remediation

FTE: 0.1FTE to 0.2FTE **Other Requirements**:

- · GFT and clinical faculty members are eligible to apply
- Experience in undergraduate or post-graduate coaching and/or remediation is an asset
- Strong interpersonal skills and leadership experience with proven ability to collaborate and sustain relationships within the faculty
