# **COVID-19 Updates**

## **Revised COVID-19 Testing Criteria**

To all AHS staff, physicians and volunteers,

This afternoon, Alberta Health announced updated COVID-19 testing criteria for all Albertans. In an effort to reduce wait times and to speed up access to results for those at greatest risk of illness, COVID-19 testing is now only offered to Albertans in the groups listed below, at this time. Effective 3:30 p.m. today (Oct. 20, 2020), **testing in Alberta is for:** 

- Albertans with symptoms of COVID-19
- Albertans who are close contacts of a confirmed case, whether symptomatic or not
- Albertans who are linked to a known outbreak, whether symptomatic or not

All healthcare workers who are symptomatic, are a close contact of a COVID-19 case, or are linked to an outbreak <u>will</u> still receive testing.

As this new testing approach will support more rapid turnaround of test results, we anticipate that healthcare workers will be better supported in effectively managing symptoms or potential exposures.

- 1. **Call your Peer Support Team.** The Peer Support Team member can provide an empathetic ear, screen for safety and guide you to resources that exist in our community (i.e PFSP).
- Call Physician and Family Services (PFSP) 1877SOS4MDS. THIS LINE IS AVAILABLE 24/7.
  You have 6 free hours of counselling for yourself and 6 free for your family members.

#### **Rehabilitation Advice Line**

We are thrilled to share with you the launch of a new Rehabilitation Advice Line, **1-833-379-0563**. The telephone line is available for Albertans over 18 to help meet their rehabilitation needs through the COVID-19 response and beyond. Albertans can call Monday to Friday between 10 a.m. and 6 p.m. and speak to an occupational therapist or physical therapist.

The goal is to provide those recovering from COVID-19 and/or those with existing neurological; musculoskeletal conditions and/or related surgeries with information and advice about:

- · Activities and exercises
- · Strategies to manage day-to-day activities
- · Available rehabilitation services and community-based organizations across the province.

#### **AO MSK Clinic Form**

Access Orthopaedics is a multidisciplinary clinic that provides patients with musculoskeletal injuries and conditions with timely assessment and a comprehensive treatment plan. AO serves as a central triage for the shoulder and elbow surgeons in the Calgary zone as well as providing spine and general musculoskeletal assessments, physiatry and a physiotherapy services. The experienced team consists of orthopaedic surgeons, neurosurgeon, physiatrist, sports medicine physician, primary care physician and physiotherapists. All assessments are covered with a valid Alberta Health Care card.

### **Hematuria Pathway**

In collaboration with our Urology and Radiology colleagues we are proposing a new ED pathway for patients presenting with hematuria. The main change from what I presented at Grand Rounds is the recommendation of ordering a CT hematuria protocol if the patient has no recent imaging and also has urinary retention. We ask that if you order this test you put something like "gross hematuria plus urinary retention" in the history. We will pilot this pathway for 3 months and reassess thereafter. If you have any questions feel free to contact me.
