Medication Supply: Bridging Discharged Patients to Community Policy

Hi Group:

As you may already know, Shopper's Drug Mart locations in Calgary are no longer open 24/7. There will be no community pharmacy open after 2200 to 2400.

For patients that are discharged between 2300 and 0730, RNs are ONLY able to dispense 1-2 doses of a medication as per the bridging procedure and the rest is to be made available through a prescription that can be filled by the patient in the AM.

The bridging procedure can be referenced here. Note that it is fairly cumbersome for the RN's.

ComputER Corner Sunray Replacement (EDSP) terminal rollout to Calgary Zone

Starting next week, our familiar Sunray terminals will start being replaced by Dell Wyse (EDSP) terminals. This new terminal will not use Sunray cards for access, rather it will rely on your proximity card, the same card used for parking or opening doors. There will be a sensor mounted to the bottom right side of each terminal screen, tap your proximity card to log in and again to log out when finished.

The deployment schedule is as follows:

Apr 29-May 3 SHC May 6-10 RGH May 13-17 FMC May 21-24 ACH (Mon May 20 stat holiday) May 27-31 PLC

The Monday of each week is a walk-through and planning day at each site and the terminals will be installed on the Tuesday. There will be user support at each site during the deployment weeks to help with any questions or problems that arise.
