- 1. you are paid for this teaching activity (in addition to the fee for service you will bill for the visit)
- 2. you will get a sense of your clerk's skills right up front
- 3. you will start your shift with one patient already seen

The OHP is a teaching activity that has been very well received by the students and faculty alike. The model of coming in 45 minutes early has been running at the RGH for a number of months and has been well received. OHP is always on the first Monday or the first Tuesday of the block.
