A reminder that when we are working up back pain patients and a surgical emergency is in the differential (spinal epidural abscess, cauda equina syndrome or progressive motor deficit) that we obtain an MRI before consulting the spine surgeon on call.

The surgeons do not want to be in the business of helping to triage MRI's.

I realize that the management of these spine emergencies (especially from non-FMC sites) can be difficult.

I would like to develop a revised pathway for this clinical condition with input from Radiology and Spine, culminating in a set of rounds sometime in the next year.

INFO Debriefing - Pearl of the week

Thank you for taking part and requesting INFO debriefings. Each week we will be sharing one of the learning points or recommendations from cases that you have debriefed in one of the Adult ED's in Calgary.

This week's INFO Pearl

Case – A patient in cardiac arrest with ongoing CPR

Learning point / Recommendation – Consider having family in room / If you do, then must have someone to "translate" – e.g. social worker.

Several cases refer to benefit of family in the room – able to clarify code status, family requested being present, family aware of effort made to resuscitate family member. Suggest having a medical translator to clarify events and make sure the family understand process and are able to ask questions.

A brief description of the R2C2 Evidence-Informed Facilitated Feedback Workshop can be found below. This workshop will teach participants how to use an evidence informed facilitated feedback model and learning change plan that will optimize the effectiveness of the feedback and provide coaching for change for residents

The workshop is targeted towards educators who are or will be performing the following roles:

- · Academic advisors (or coaches) in CBD
- Longitudinal preceptors
- Program directors
- · Rotation coordinators who are responsible for synthesizing multiple assessments and providing residents with summative feedback
