The Office of CME&PD at the Cumming School of Medicine supports the continuing professional development of physicians and allied health professionals. The Physician Learning Program (PLP) is an Alberta Medical Association (AMA) funded program at the University of Calgary, with a sister site at the University of Alberta, that uses administrative health data to support physician learning, quality improvement and knowledge translation in Alberta.

* PLP Vision: To focus and customize physician professional development to achieve the best possible health outcomes for Albertans

* PLP Mission: To strengthen physician learning decisions through individualized practice-based information, reflection, and by offering support for knowledge translation. The Assistant Dean Physician Learning Program will have the following major responsibilities:

* Oversee and/or design of new health services research projects

* Collaborate with health services leaders to build joint projects to improve patient care using audit and feedback and knowledge translation strategies

* Develop strategic partnerships with data custodians and provincial organizations to use data to inform quality improvement initiatives and knowledge translation practices

* Work with the PLP leadership team (managing director and medical directors), the University of Alberta PLP leadership team, and the Associate Dean of CME&PD to prioritize PLP projects and identify future direction for the program

* Identify and develop approaches for capturing metrics on evaluation and performance of the PLP

* Take leadership role in the Physician Learning Program support of the Choosing Wisely Alberta campaign

MCCQEII recruitment for the weekend of Saturday May 4th and Sunday May 5th

Hello,

I hope you will join us as a Clinical Examiner for the Spring 2019 session of the Medical Council of Canada Qualifying Examination Part II (MCCQEII)! We are searching for Physicians to work one or two days over the weekend Saturday May 4th and Sunday May 5th. The format of the examination has recently been expanded to 14 minute encounters on Day 1 and 6 minute-paired encounters on Day 2. Your participation helps to professionally standardize the scoring process of the medically trained candidates who work through 12 standardized clinical cases over this weekend. Examiners will skillfully score the clinical reasoning, the sense of professionalism, and the ethical practice style of candidates using structured content and communication check lists.

In preparation, you will login to a 45- minute online tutorial issued by Ottawa describing the purpose and process of the MCCQEII examination. It is mandatory for all participating examiners to register and complete this module before the May 4-5th weekend. This is a confidential high stakes examination for the Medical profession, and educating all physician examiners to a similar skill level, regardless of past experience, is deemed necessary to ensure high inter-rater reliability standards.
