Calgary Zone EMS / ED flow initiative showing remarkable early gains

Dear colleagues

The dangers and wastefulness of EMS park have been on the front burner in the Calgary Zone for the past 7 months. Thanks to the persistence and dedication of Neil Collins, Adam Oster and the other EM clinical leaders in the Zone who have been sounding the alarm and highlighting the system-level nature of the problem, we are seeing promising improvements that I hope you are experiencing first hand.

Through a process led by Dr. Sid Viner and Brenda Huband our Calgary Zone dyad leaders, 9 initiatives were selected to address the access block and crowding that threatens our mission as emergency care providers on a regular basis. These initiatives, some only 7 weeks old, included the Emergency Physician Lead pilot currently underway at the PLC that has been led by Rick, Cathy and Neil as well as projects related to closer EMS oversight, revamped surge protocols for EIPs, enhanced PT/OT support in the ED (Laurie-Ann co-lead) and other efforts focusing on improving hospital capacity and care for mental health patients. While not among the 9 projects, a QI initiative led by Adam and Jen Jordan at FMC and supported by Ian and David is making inroads as well.

The 90th percentile for EMS holding is one of the major metrics being followed to see if all this effort is paying off and <u>as you can see from the graph attached</u> it seems to be. These remain early days and sustainability of these efforts is under discussion. I would like to thank everyone who has contributed to the hard work of planning and implementing these projects and all of your efforts in making ED flow a priority issue on shift.

Learning point – One of the most frequently noted, positive interventions in a resuscitation is the use of a "Pre-briefing" by physicians before the patient arrives in the resus area. Clinical opportunities in pre-clerkship medical school

Look out for students to be contacting you about 2 clinical opportunities in pre-clerkship medical school. Both of these opportunities are fantastic for junior staff and locums. Any questions can be directed to Meira (calgaryerelectives@gmail.com)

- 1. <u>Pre-clerkship electives</u>. These are elective hours that students partake in between first and second year in July. Students have a list of preceptors that have volunteered in the past and will contact you directly to arrange the hours. These are keen and motivated students who are a pleasure to have on shift. If you have not volunteered with this in the past and want to have your name on the list, let Meira (<u>calgaryerelectives@gmail.com</u>) know. Once you have the dates arranged with your student, simply email them to Tris so we can keep track for IP&C.
- 2. <u>Applied Evidence Based Medicine (previously med440)</u>. This is a 24 hour commitment to a student between first and second year. It can be done as 3 full shifts, or 6 half shifts, or whatever schedule you work out with the student. This year there will only be one block of med 440 (previously there were 2) which is split between April 16-May 28, and then again July 23-Sept 3. Due to the light commitment and extensive time period during which the shifts can be done, preceptors are welcome to take on more than one student if they wish. If you are interested, email Tris with your name and how many students you are willing to take. We will ensure an equitable matching of students.
