Mental Health Emergency Physician Liaison (MH-EPL) and overnight psychiatry consults at FMC

Jennifer Nicol has taken the new role of the Mental Health Emergency Physician Liaison (MH-EPL) with the objectives to optimize the delivery of mental health services in our departments, using evidence based best practices, working closely with our colleagues with psychiatry. She is currently working on a standardized approach to medical clearance of our psychiatric patients, and a methamphetamine induced psychosis treatment pathway.

What I ask of you, is to please contact me with any concerns or questions you have related to mental health care delivery in our EDs, with ideas you have for process improvements, or with any questions. Your feedback will help guide issues that I tackle over the next year, and is greatly important and appreciated. I will be using the weekly newsletter to send out updates, so please stay tuned!

PLC/FMC overnight psychiatric consults:

If a patient is "medically cleared", meaning sober and medically stable, with an active psychiatric concern that requires their expertise for disposition (i.e. safe discharge or admission), then it is appropriate to consult the

resident on call overnight, and not hold the patient until morning. The psychiatry residents are aware of this at both PLC and FMC, and should you encounter any pushback or resistance to them coming in, please email me directly and let me know.
