#### To Clarify the Elective/Shadowing Policy and Opportunities:

- 1. Med440: U of C students in second year. 24h over 4 months. Matches are arranged by Judy and myself. Once shifts are arranged they get sent to Judy for IP&C tracking.
- 2. Pre-clerkship Electives: U of C students in first and early second year. 1 week electives, 4 shifts per week. Students find their own preceptors & can be split between two preceptors if needed.

#### Looking for ED physician participation in CIHR funded study:

Surgical masks have similar efficacy to N95 respirators for protecting healthcare workers against influenza and other respiratory viral infections. It is important to assess whether the same is true for COVID-19. This study is a randomized controlled trial in which healthcare workers are randomized to either medical masks or N95 respirators when providing care to patients with COVID-19 for non-aerosol generating procedures. The primary outcome is RT-PCR confirmed COVID-19. Healthcare workers who provide direct care to COVID-19 or suspected COVID-19 patients are eligible. Follow up is for 10 weeks, where 1 or 2 brief text messages per

week are sent about symptoms and exposures. A blood test at the start and at the end of the study is obtained to test for antibodies. The study is funded by CIHR and WHO and has been endorsed by public health leaders in Canada.

Topic: Pulseless Electrical Activity & Pseudo-PEA: Exploring practices beyond ACLS

## **Description:**

Despite being recognized as a form of cardiac arrest since the 1960's, Pulseless Electrical Activity (PEA) has received significantly less attention in research compared to its shockable rhythm counterparts. Point-of-care ultrasound (POCUS) has identified two distinct entities presenting as PEA: those with cardiac activity (pseudo-PEA) and those without (true PEA). Emerging data suggests that pseudo-PEA represents a significant portion of PEA cardiac arrests and may have improved survival compared to true-PEA. This session will discuss an update to the evidence for various diagnostic approaches and therapeutic interventions used in PEA with the aim of providing practical take-a-ways that providers can implement on their next shift.
