Are You Up To Date on Your N95 Fit Test?

Due to supply challenges with existing N95 respirator models, AHS has secured alternate N95 respirators in order to keep staff and physicians safe.

As a result, any worker who requires a respirator according to the <u>Who Needs an N95 Respirator</u> <u>Algorithm</u> and is currently fit tested to the **1870+**, **8110s**, **9105**, or **9105s** (or does not have a current fit test within 24 months) should be fit tested to an alternate model.

The *Fit test clinic schedule* is available on the <u>Respiratory Protection</u> Insite page. It is critical to ensure that physicians are fit tested on alternate models as inventory of other models decreases.

Opportunity for physician volunteers to assist in on-site Covid-19 immunization clinics for Hospital-Affiliated Physicians

Alberta Health Services has fielded a large number of inquiries from physicians eager to contribute to the effort to immunize hospital staff against Covid-19 as quickly and as efficiently as possible.

AHS is grateful for the willingness and enthusiasm of physicians to support this important initiative, and would like to welcome interested hospital-associated physicians to volunteer at vaccination clinics at upcoming in-hospital clinics.

Several points to emphasize:

First: This will be on a <u>volunteer</u> basis: there are no AHS funds available to allocate to physician remuneration for this effort. That said, this is a tremendous opportunity for physicians to contribute further

to the fight to end this pandemic. Physician volunteers will be provided with a \$1 contract; the contract will address any issues related to liability and health information confidentiality. Second: For those who volunteer, some materials and a training module will need to be reviewed/completed — this will require a total time commitment of about four hours. Third: Volunteer time blocks will be about four hours per session. Once a roster of volunteer physicians is established for each site, physicians will be matched, according to availability, to open slots in the vaccination clinic schedule. Dr. Edward Les has been tasked by Provincial Medical Affairs to coordinate this initiative in

Calgary. Interested physicians can email him directly at $Edward \ Les$ (<u>PLEASE INCLUDE THE SITE</u> WITH WHICH YOU ARE AFFILIATED).

Dr. Les will compile physician rosters for each site, and will distribute contracts and direct volunteer physicians to training materials to review in advance of being deployed to vaccination clinics.
