PCP analogue on the streets of Calgary

Calgary Police Service has identified the presence of a substance known as 3-Methoxyphencyclidine, which is an analogue of PCP, also known as "angel dust" and is a hallucinogenic.

Of note: "Clinical Manifestations: violent behavior, nystagmus, tachycardia, hypertension, anesthesia, and analgesia.

The clinical picture may wax and wane between extreme agitation and sedation, because PCP can produce CNS stimulation and depression through its different clinical effects in the CNS... Sedation and loss of inhibition tend to occur with ingestions of 1 to 5 mg, with the CNS findings of slurred speech, violent behavior and blank staring, horizontal, vertical, or rotatory nystagmus, ataxia, hyperthermia, and seizures at these doses."

UCalgary Suspends travel to several countries impacted by COVID-19

After careful consideration of the risks to the campus community from travel to countries experiencing community transmission of COVID-19, the University of Calgary has suspended all travel to the following areas for student and non-academic staff until September 2020:

- China
- Hong Kong
- Japan
- Iran
- Italy
- South Korea
- Singapore

Academic staff are also being encouraged to avoid travel to these countries. More info.

Influenza update - Feb 28

After reaching an initial peak in week 52 (618 cases) and then a second peak in week 5 (637 cases), provincial influenza activity has steadily declined through to week 8 (396 cases). Currently, across all zones and all influenza subtypes, the number of new influenza cases are essentially either declining or steady:

So far this influenza season, there have been 7,004 lab-confirmed influenza cases, including 1,256 hospitalized cases (the latter number includes 119 ICU admissions and 32 deaths); 68% of hospitalized cases had Influenza A (predominantly H3N2).
