Career Exploration Half Days

Undergraduate Medical Education has introduced some additional clinical sessions as part of the Career Exploration Program for our pre-clerkship students. Pandemic restrictions have meant that these students have lost opportunities to look at careers of interest in the clinical setting, for example, shadowing. With pre-clerkship elective time very limited, the Career Exploration Program has added 6 half days of time where students can arrange to spend time with preceptors doing their clinical work. Many of these experiences will be observation only and there is no expectation of any evaluation of the student. The goal is to allow them to see a sample of the clinical work of various medical disciplines so they can decide what they'd like to learn more about during their clerkship electives.

The more people that are aware of this, the smoother things will be for both preceptors and students.

What's new in the myEDapp?

In collaboration with some of our infectious disease colleagues and the STI clinic, we have created an STI pathway for the emergency department that can now be found on the MyEDapp. It is searchable if you type in 'STI'. This may prove to be useful in identifying high risk/vulnerable patients that frequent the ED where we should be trying to test more often. There is also a cheat sheet outlining which swabs are needed for the different tests. As many of you know, there is also a provincial wide syphilis outbreak and the pathway suggests an approach to testing, treating, and followup for these patients. Recovery Coaches

We are happy to announce a partnership with the Rapid Access Addictions Medicine Clinic (RAAM) for ED patients interested in speaking with a peer about substance use or other challenges surrounding an addiction. I have included a FAQ sheet and copy of the referral form which anyone can fill out (ED nurse,

ED social work, ED MD, PES) and have faxed to the Recovery Coaches at RAAM. It has also been circulated to all of the managers for social work, PES and the physician groups. The documents are also available on the My ED App - just search "recovery coach".

We currently have four wonderful Recovery Coaches - people with lived experience of addiction who have been trained and supported through the Canadian Mental Health Association's (CMHA) Recovery College. The Recovery Coaches are employees of AHS with "office space" at RAAM and salary funding provided by a pilot grant from the City of Calgary's Mental Health Initiative. More details are in the FAQ sheet and I am happy to answer any questions!

The Recovery Coaches are accepting referrals from the ED and will follow up with the client by phone (or at a shelter/support centre) the next business day. Eventually we would love to have them on site in the ED for real time support but we are still working out the logistics.

CalgaryEM HALO Procedural Skill Curriculum Development - Needs Assessment Survey

We are looking to create a longitudinal curriculum that uses a mix of virtual simulations, task trainers, mental rehearsal, and educational resources to help provide Calgary Emergency Physicians with opportunities to practice **High A** cuity, **Low O**ccurrence (**HALO**) procedural skills. Examples of HALO skills include cricothyrotomy, resuscitative hysterotomy, and lateral canthotomy.
