Building an ED Treatment Planning Hub - Funding Available

To bolster the sustainability of this committee, I would like to build a "hub" of MDs interested in authorship. The Connect Care & Physician Builder Lead promotes clinical improvement through hands on involvement during the Connect Care launches. This role trains for Epic Physician or Content Builder Certification and builds organizational capacity for CIS customization, optimization, content development, testing and analytics. Clinician Builders bridge clinical and technical domains by improving characterization of user needs while easing pathways to solutions. In short, Clinician Builders help organize the CIS user population, improve communication between the IT team and users, generate CIS content, and promote meaningful use of the CIS.

A key part of an effective clinician engagement strategy, clinician builders promote end-user organization, empowerment and accountability. Key to empowerment is building capacity to customize and shape the CIS to better address clinical, quality improvement, safety, and innovation and education goals. Connect Care & Physician Builders gain the understanding, tools and relationships needed to be effective change agents.

About the Position: The Associate Research Director is considered a **0.2FTE** position and is paid from the University of Calgary.
