Operations

Referrals to Sciatica Clinic

Our colleagues on the spine service at FMC continue to accept urgent referrals to their Sciatica Clinic. This partnership was inspired by a research project the spine team is doing and the clinic benefits us and our patient population by having a "rapid access" sciatica clinic that will provide comprehensive care for the patient even if they do not consent to participate in their study.

At this time, it is only available to the FMC ED team. No research consent needed on our end. When you are making a note in Connect Care, just click on communications to send a referral directly to Dr. Ganesh Swamy and the clinic will take care of introducing the research study at that time. Thank you.

Connect Care Updates

- 1) I have reserved conference room 10302 on the 10th floor at RGH for a few ASAP prescriber review sessions as we get closer to launch. While this will NOT replace basic training and personalization sessions, those who have persistent questions after completing their training will hopefully find these group sessions helpful for troubleshooting common workflow questions and also some tips / tricks that could make your life easier during the transition to the new EMR. The dates are: April 19, 20, 27, and 28, at 12:00-14:00. Anyone can sign up (even from launch 4 and 5 sites) but launch 6 physicians will be prioritized if enrollment is larger than expected. Alberta Human Tissue and Organ Donation Act

This is a reminder that modifications to the Alberta Human Tissue and Organ Donation Act become Alberta law tomorrow (April 1, 2023).

What does this mean practically? To keep it simple, **the default should be to call SAOTDP about every death** that occurs in the ED (there are a few exceptions, see flow sheet at the bottom).

 In mechanically ventilated patients, the call needs to occur prior to extubation / transition to C1 or C2 goals of care (for consideration of organ donation). In non-ventilated patients, the call can also be after death (for consideration of tissue donation)

Even if a family / alternate decision maker has expressed that the patient would not have wanted to be a donor, it is still necessary to check the donation registry (and calling SAOTDP is the only way to do this). Families often don't know that the patient had, in fact, registered, and really should have this information.

The SAOTDP coordinator on call can be found in ROCA. The donor coordinator will check the Alberta Organ and Tissue Donation Registry when you call and help you sort out eligibility for donation.

DEM Faculty Small Group Sessions aka Group Emergency Medicine Sessions (GEMS): Ask and you shall receive!

We have done an <u>education focused needs assessment of our DEM physicians</u> and one major area that was identified was the need for **faculty only** small group sessions to *cover high yield emergency medicine topics* together.

The DEM is launching NEW **faculty only**, <u>expert facilitated</u>, <u>small group sessions</u> open to <u>ALL DEM</u> <u>Staff Physicians.</u>

WHEN: Once monthly (October 2023 - June 2024; Not running over summer)

WHAT: Topics are pre-planned with the goal to cover bread and butter Emergency Medicine topics and will be facilitated IN PERSON by experts in the topic areas. Some of the topics we will be covering this year include: pediatrics (twice), addictions, sports medicine, connect care optimization, geriatrics and neurology. Each session will be 1.5 hours long, with a maximum of 20 staff participating in each group. The goal is to have not just the expertise of the facilitator but also that of the various years of practice and knowledge of the staff attending the session for a shared experience.

HOW: <u>Using the link</u>, you can sign up for ONE of 7 possible time slots. Given these sessions don't start until October there's lots of time for you to request shifts off/yellow to accommodate the sessions.

WHY: Because you asked for it!

WHERE: At the medical school/FMC (or a location of your groups choosing if you decide to have a change of scenery for a session.)

Rules of engagement:

- · Sign up for ONE of seven possible time slots
- You will need to commit to attending 60% of the sessions (5/9) IN PERSON. There will be no virtual option to attend.
- Every group will have a room booked at Foothills Medical Center (the locations will be
 updated on the google document). Your group may choose to pick an alternative location but
 please notify me if you are using a different location so the facilitators are also aware
 (someone's home, restaurant, coffee shop, wine bar, etc.) Please keep in mind there is no
 funding for alternative locations, food or drinks.
- The goal is to have each group be a mix of faculty from different sites, gender and stage of
 career to ensure a robust discussion. If you are able to make a few different dates/times
 please try to choose one based on that diversity.
- Given that life happens and that on occasion you may not be available to attend your usual small group, you may swap into another session running in the same week but you are only allowed to do this TWICE in the year (please email me if you are going to swap into another session).
- There is no required pre-work to the sessions however there may be podcasts, blogposts, journal articles emailed to you prior to a session if you would like to have a topic refresher before attending.
- These sessions will be a safe learning space for everyone who attends. There is ZERO tolerance for any inappropriate or unprofessional behaviour.

You will receive a post-attendance survey at the end of the year to give anonymous feedback on any and all of the sessions as well as give suggestions for the year to come. Opportunity for new junior ultrasound director education lead

I've now been in the role of ultrasound program director both for junior and senior residents for 5 years and I think it is time for someone new to take over the role of junior director.

I feel that some fresh ideas will help expand and grow the great curriculum we already have and new approaches might enhance the experience for residents.

I'd like to focus my energies more into further enhancing the senior resident ultrasound sessions and blocks. My hope is that one of you may be interested in taking over the lead for junior ultrasound education.

This would be a paid position as I would ask for the stipend I currently get to be split. That would make it a 1 day per month FTE paid at \$3000 split into two payments/yr. In addition, any bedside teaching you do would still be paid at the PGME rate.

The focus would be on organizing and running the CRISP course (Calgary Residency Introductory Sonography Program) for the EM/FRCPC and PEM residents and getting the FR residents through their core US curriculum.

I already have the CRISP course scheduled this year and would mentor/execute the course preparation process this year to help the next person transition into the role. I will also be attending the course (July 13, 2023 BTW-save the date everyone).

You do not need to have an ultrasound fellowship to perform this role but you should have a good knowledge of core ultrasound skills. I am also flexible about how this transition can play out so please feel free to contact me to discuss specifics.
