DEM Faculty Small Group Sessions aka Group Emergency Medicine Sessions (GEMS): Ask and you shall receive!

We have done an <u>education focused needs assessment of our DEM physicians</u> and one major area that was identified was the need for **faculty only** small group sessions to *cover high yield emergency medicine topics* together.

The DEM is launching NEW **faculty only**, <u>expert facilitated</u>, *small group session*s open to <u>ALL DEM</u> <u>Staff Physicians</u>.

WHEN: Once monthly (October 2023 - June 2024; Not running over summer)

WHAT: Topics are pre-planned with the goal to cover bread and butter Emergency Medicine topics and will be facilitated IN PERSON by experts in the topic areas. Some of the topics we will be covering this year include: pediatrics (twice), addictions, sports medicine, connect care optimization, geriatrics and neurology. Each session will be 1.5 hours long, with a maximum of 20 staff participating in each group. The goal is to have not just the expertise of the facilitator but also that of the various years of practice and knowledge of the staff attending the session for a shared experience.

HOW: <u>Using the link</u>, you can sign up for ONE of 7 possible time slots. Given these sessions don't start until October there's lots of time for you to request shifts off/yellow to accommodate the sessions.

WHY: Because you asked for it!

WHERE: At the medical school/FMC (or a location of your groups choosing if you decide to have a change of scenery for a session.)

Rules of engagement:

- Sign up for ONE of seven possible time slots
- You will need to commit to attending 60% of the sessions (5/9) IN PERSON. There will be no virtual option to attend.
- Every group will have a room booked at Foothills Medical Center (the locations will be updated on the google document). Your group may choose to pick an alternative location but please notify me if you are using a different location so the facilitators are also aware (someone's home, restaurant, coffee shop, wine bar, etc.) Please keep in mind there is no funding for alternative locations, food or drinks.
- The goal is to have each group be a mix of faculty from different sites, gender and stage of career to ensure a robust discussion. If you are able to make a few different dates/times please try to choose one based on that diversity.
- Given that life happens and that on occasion you may not be available to attend your usual small group, you may swap into another session running in the same week but you are only allowed to do this TWICE in the year (please email me if you are going to swap into another session).
- There is no required pre-work to the sessions however there may be podcasts, blogposts, journal articles emailed to you prior to a session if you would like to have a topic refresher before attending.
- These sessions will be a safe learning space for everyone who attends. There is ZERO tolerance for any inappropriate or unprofessional behaviour.

You will receive a post-attendance survey at the end of the year to give anonymous feedback on any and all of the sessions as well as give suggestions for the year to come. SP cases are mock OSCE-style sessions where the clerk will interact with an SP. Each preceptor would be responsible for the two cases noted. The clerk performs a 10min case with an SP, while the preceptor and group watch, they then return for feedback which is facilitated by the preceptor.

SIM cases are done in the SIM lab, the preceptor will act as a nurse during the case and then debrief the group afterward. A SIM trained SP will run the SIMman, the preceptor is not expected to run any SIM tech.

Signing up confirms you for the session right away. If you are having trouble signing up, email me sessions you are interested in and I can add you.
