Updated Immediate Transition (IT) Bed Process

Recently, a multidisciplinary workgroup convened to optimize the use of Immediate Transition (IT) Beds in the zone.

The workgroup included multiple ED representatives, including Colin Del Castilho (AZMD for Continuing Care), Marge McGillivray (Geriatrics Lead), Paige Guinn (SHC Geriatrics NP) and myself. In addition, the workgroup engaged LTC/Rehab physicians, Transition services nurses and Hospitalist representatives.

This work was undertaken because the IT Bed process was creating challenges for all parties involved, including:

EDs

- Prolonged ED length of stay with patients commonly held in the ED overnight awaiting evaluation for IT beds (not infrequently only to be declined in the morning)

- Pharmacy supports for the Best Possible Medical History (BPMH) were not available after hours leading to physicians left to do this task unassisted

Rehab Facilities

- Patients being transferred to rehab with issues that could not be adequately managed at rehab (e.g., pain refractory to oral analgesia) or requiring further medical workup or treatment (e.g., further assessment of potential causes of refractory back pain (e.g.r/o mets/osteo/discitis), resulting in patients being transferred back to the ED for further workup and/or hospital admission

Patients

- Poor patient experience with missed home medications and prolonged and uncomfortable stays in the disruptive ED environment increasing the risk of delirium

We hope that updated process ([see attached file](#)) will better serve all parties through the following changes:

No longer holding patients in ED overnight awaiting IT bed evaluation thereby reducing ED LOS and providing a better patient experience

- If the IT Bed evaluation cannot be completed before 2000, the Hospitalist service has agreed to admit these patients
- This also better aligns with pharmacy supports for performing BPMH

Restricting evaluation to a more focused group of patients more likely to benefit from rehab and less likely to bounce back to the ED

- This should mean fewer patients declined from IT beds
- Please see the attached document for full details, but note that the following patient presentations are **now excluded from IT beds**:
 1. Patients needing admission for **acute or chronic back pain**, particularly if accompanied by radicular pain (experience with this patient population indicates they tend to do better with admission to acute care facilities)
 2. Patients experiencing **frequent falls with no known correctable etiology**.

There were also a couple of important requests from the Rehab physicians:

- **Please place a weight bearing status order for all patients** in ConnectCare as part of the IT Bed IFT Orders
- **Please ensure that any necessary referrals/follow-up appointments are ordered (e.g, Cast Clinic)** and documented in ConnectCare prior to the patient leaving the ED

We have also agreed that decisions about appropriate medical work-up are at the discretion of the ED MRHP (e.g., urinalysis). However, we encourage the Transition Nurses to raise any additional concerns they identify during their assessment with ED physicians. If you are asked about a particular concern/test, please try to answer their questions clearly, and if you do not feel further testing is warranted, please explain why.

We are hopeful that the new process will be an improvement for our EDs, our rehab facilities, and most importantly, our patients.

There is an ongoing evaluation of the program, so please feel to reach out to me with any questions or concerns.
