Hello Everyone - here is this week's Connect Care Update



### 1) Hyperdrive Cometh

Another friendly reminder that our Connect Care PRD desktop icons will be changing briefly while the system migrates to the Hyperdrive platform. By now you will have noticed a new orange PRD Hyperdrive icon on the desktop. The PLC will be switching to Hyperdrive next week (February 21) and will be using the new orange icons to access Connect Care between February 21 - 28. All other sites should continue to use the old red PRD icons. The following week (February 28) all other sites will switch to Hyperdrive at which point the orange icons will disappear and a new red PRD icon will appear on the

desktop that all sites can use. Another way of saying this is that you only have to worry about using the temporary orange PRD icon if you are working at the PLC between Feb 21-28; at all other sites you can continue to use the old red PRD icon, then the new red icon after Feb 28, and you can ignore the orange icon entirely. #### 2) Provider Note Template Pitfalls

Are you using a note template that employs smart text to auto-populate the patient's name and ULI in your Provider Note? You might like to know that this could lead to some minor administrative headaches in patients who are initially registered as unknown (UNK-) at triage. In these cases, the name and ULI that populates the smart text field may end up being different than the existing name / ULI in the patient's old chart, which will lead to a flag being sent to Health Information Management (HIM) once the charts are merged at the end of the visit. You will then receive an Inbasket / email request from HIM to edit the chart and correct the updated ULI / name. This isn't an overly onerous process but can certainly add to the Inbasket load we've all been struggling with. If you'd like to avoid this, consider removing any smart text that auto-populates the patient's name / ULI from your note template; this information is typically redundant with the patient's demographic data, and removing it generally won't detract from your charting in any way. ### February 16, 2024:

Recommendations for promotion to Professor (Clinical/Adjunct/Research only) due.

Documents required:

- List of names/addresses/email of six external referees. Identify the three referees nominated by candidate. Provide brief background comments about each referee, including any relationship with the candidate. As per Section C2 of the CAR Criteria, external referees must i) be external to the University, ii) hold or have held academic rank at the full Professor level and iii) have an arm's length relationship with the candidate (not published together in the last six years, not a former supervisor, and not a current collaborator)
- · Updated curriculum vitae in Faculty format
- Department Head's letter of recommendation. (If candidate holds a joint appointment in other Department(s), arrange for other Head(s) to forward their recommendation letters by this date.)
- · Five best publications
- Separate list of candidate's five best publications, including a brief overview of the importance of each publication and, in multi-authored publications, a definition of the role of the applicant in the work


### **CAEP Geriatric EM Course**
