1) Access Orthopedics NOT Requiring Patient Email After All

We received a communication last week from a new Access Orthopedics admin assistant stating that the clinic was requiring all referrals to include the patient's email address (or a statement that the patient does not have an email address) in order to be accepted.

It turns out that this is actually not the case for ED/UCC referrals. If you can include a patient email in the referral, this is great, but it is NOT mandatory and your referral will NOT be declined if an email is not included. Thanks to Allison Foran for clarifying.

3) ED Dispensing of Bridging Medications

Just letting you know about an update we received last week regarding the ESCN Guidelines for dispensing bridging medications:

"The AHS <u>Dispensing of Medications to Patients with a Discharge Medication Order Guideline</u> has been revised effective July 18, 2024. The revision edit is specific to Section 1.2 exemption to include in circumstances where the authorized prescriber has ordered post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP) kits (e.g., HIV-PEP, STI-PEP), the healthcare professional may dispense the quantity of doses as ordered. If the patient requires a prescription for ongoing therapy to complete their treatment plan, refer to the Alberta Health Services (AHS) <u>Bridge Supply and Pass Medications Procedure</u>."

To summarize the current ESCN Guideline recommendations:

- A maximum of 2 doses of medication can be dispensed "if a community Pharmacist cannot be reasonably accessed by the patient before the next dose of medication is due."
- a. **Exceptions**: The health care professional may dispense the quantity of doses for the following medications as ordered by the authorized prescriber:
- i. partial-opioid agonist therapy medications (e.g., buprenorphine/naloxone) for the treatment of opioid use disorder until the patient can access an opioid use disorder treatment program; or
- ii. post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP) kits (e.g., HIV-PEP, STI-PEP)
- *Basically, try to stick to a maximum of 2-doses of bridging medications wherever possible, except for providing opiate agonist therapy or HIV/STI post-exposure prophylaxis.

Kudos Corner Patient Commendation:

Dr. Betzner, nurses Courtney and Kristin at FMC

I went to the Foothills Emergency Room in June, due to complications from a miscarriage. I had a lot of bleeding and was faint (uterine hemorrhage). I was kindly helped by Courtney (RN) and Kristin (RN). They were gentle and prompt in their delivery of care and made me feel comfortable during trouble. Soon after getting settled in my ER bed, Dr. Betzner introduced himself, even showing me his badge (I appreciated this as it helped me to better remember his name). From the outset, Dr. Betzner was kind, compassionate, sympathetic, patient, professional, and clinically skillful. I was impressed too with how kind and considerate he was of the nursing staff; he spoke to and of them with respect and collegiality. Dr. Betzner made me feel as if I was his only patient, though I know very well this was likely not the case. He personally checked up on me, ensured I was comfortable, encouraged me to ask questions, listened to my concerns, performed a blood pressure check, and ambulated with me. I've never had a doctor spend so much time with me! Beyond being a patient, but previously having been a registered nurse in an academic acute care setting myself, I worked with and encountered many physicians. Dr. Betzner is the best of the best! Dr. Betzner's medical practice includes but goes beyond "good bedside manner" and "clinical expertise." He is a physician with the rare combination of genuine heartfelt concern for his patients and intentional aim to deliver exceptional care - the art and science of medicine. Dr. Betzner saved my life, calmed my nerves, and encouraged my heart. I will always be grateful for him and to him. He is a model physician and human being! Thank you for this opportunity to express my gratitude.

Pediatric MSK Injury Physiatry Referrals

Our local physiatrists, Drs. Jacqui Stone + Jordan Raugust, at Kinesis Physical Medicine and EMG are accepting referrals for paediatric MSK injuries. They are typically able to see within 2-4 weeks but can see more urgently, as needed. They are able to help with follow up of patients with MSK injuries that are not suited for cast clinic referral and would benefit from support after an injury and guidance with rehab/physiotherapy. They are also able to see paediatric PMR concerns, such as gait disorders, back or join pain. Routine EMG can be performed for patients with complaints of focal numbness/tingling or pain (query neuromuscular disorder, however, is best seen by Peds Neuro). There is also currently a PMR R5 that is hoping to have a more peds-centric practice and is keen for referrals for more exposure. The referral through Connect Care would be an external referral to Kinesis through the usual ambulatory PMR referral.
