Connect Care Update

1) IT Bed Transfers

As we settle into the new IFT workflow for IT bed transfers, I am hoping to collate experiences you've had using this workflow in the 'real world'. Whether they are positive or negative, if you have recently transferred a patient to an IT bed please consider letting me know how the process went. If we are going to troubleshoot barriers to efficiency we need to have concrete examples of where to focus. 2) Repatriation to Carewest LTC Beds

Just a quick reminder that all Carewest facilities, including LTC, are now on Connect Care. This means that when you are discharging any LTC resident back to a Carewest facility, the IFT workflow should be used (in other words, these patients should have 'Transferred to another facility' selected as their disposition, rather than 'Discharged'). In contrast to new admissions to IT beds, these patients will already have an up-to-date

list of the medications they are receiving at the facility, and so they do not need to have all of their home medications re-ordered. The only medications that need to be ordered via the 'med rec' process are any new medications or dosing changes to existing medications.

(The short version is that you would follow essentially the same steps as the IT bed process, but you can skip reordering or dispensing any medications that were not added or changed as a result of your care).

NOTE that this does not apply to the majority of LTC residents, only those who are residents of Carewest facilities (eg - Fanning, Colonel Belcher, Glenmore Park).
