News from the Section of Clinical Pharmacology and Toxicology

We are pleased to announce that Dr. Riley Hartmann is the new PADIS Associate Medical Director starting September 1, 2024. Riley completed his medical school at UofC, Emergency Medicine residency at UofSaskatchewan, and his Clinical Pharmacology and Toxicology Fellowship at UofC. He is an attending emergency physician in Saskatoon and one of the physicians who takes call for both PADIS and the Clinical Pharmacology consultation service. Riley takes over from Dr. Scott Lucyk, who had been in the role since 2017.

A reminder to all Calgary Emergency Physicians that in September 2023, PADIS instituted a Health Care Professional Priority Line when a call is made to PADIS.

- When calling PADIS, you will first hear our standard greeting. After the standard greeting, you will then be given an option to enter the health care professional queue (e.g., physician, nurse, pharmacist, paramedic).
- Once in this queue, if your patient or situation meets any of the criteria below, you can then press 1 and your call will be placed at the top of the queue to be answered by the next available Poison Information Specialist.
- This priority queue is intended for health care professionals needing advice for emergent patients who have had a drug or toxin exposure PLUS one of the following:

Critically ill or unstable, such as:

1. pre-arrest
 2. have arrested
 3. seizing continuously
 4. hypotensive
- ii. Chemical burns greater than 25% body surface area
 - iii. Potentially require immediate, unusual antidote treatment for a highly toxic substance as their clinical condition is or could become unstable
 - iv. Mass casualty situation **OR** where there are multiple patients with the same exposure overwhelming your hospital capacity.

- We hope that if used properly, this will help to eliminate unnecessary delays in treating the most critical patients.

The PADIS medical toxicologists and fellows have recently completed a comprehensive review of all our management guidelines. These guidelines are available on the PADIS AHS Insite page at <https://insite.albertahealthservices.ca/padis/Page26990.aspx> and can also be sent to the bedside by our Information Specialists upon request. They are updated as needed throughout the current cycle. The next comprehensive review is scheduled for 2027.



MedSIS 3C TRANSITION

Phase 1 of the launch of MedSIS 3C is scheduled for October 2nd and will include Emergency Medicine along with 22 other residency programs. This platform will replace Mainport/E-Portfolio for EPA completion for residency programs that have transitioned to CBD (this includes essentially all Royal College residents that you work with including off-service residents like surgical and medicine residents). Narrative global evaluations will continue to utilize One45 for the time being. **In order to be able to use MedSIS you will need to know your UCalgary SSO credentials OR your AHS Credentials for your AHS email.** If you do not already know these, please review this document to help troubleshoot and confirm your credentials:
