\*EQUIPMENT CHANGE: NEW Esophageal balloons for Upper GI Bleeds

Just a reminder that the Linton esophageal balloon which we have used in the Calgary Zone for many years has recently been discontinued by the manufacturer.

The Blakemore tube has now been substituted. It's very similar to the Linton, but adds an esophageal balloon (which you don't necessarily have to use).
