ED Disposition Escalation Process

Connect Care Updates

Many thanks to **Dr. Lanette Prediger, Provincial Medical Informatics Lead (PMIL)** for the update below:

There are new Ambulatory/Inpatient DI Interventional Radiology Order Sets that were just recently approved and went live in CC. The reasons for the changes were to ensure the ordering provider is submitting the orders for each test correctly, and that the orders are in the appropriate phase of care so as to not be missed by radiologists/nurses/technologists who perform the tests. The new order sets are:

- Interventional Radiology Thoracentesis/Paracentesis (Ambulatory/Inpatient)
- Interventional Radiology Fluid/Abscess Aspiration/Drainage (Ambulatory/Inpatient)
- Interventional Radiology Joint Aspiration/Injection (Ambulatory/Inpatient)
- Interventional Radiology Mass/Organ Biopsy (Ambulatory/Inpatient)
- Ambulatory Interventional Radiology Lumbar Puncture

Moving forward, using the order sets will be the only way to order many IR tests (essentially all Ultrasound, CT, or IR guided Procedures):

- Angiography/Ultrasound Guided Aspiration and/or Injection
- Angiography/CT/Ultrasound Guided Fluid Aspiration
- Angiography/CT/Ultrasound Biopsy
- Thoracentesis/Paracentesis Procedures

Overview: A single centre US retrospective study comparing a paralytic-first strategy versus a sedative-first strategy in emergency department rapid sequence intubations to reduce first-pass failure.

Work Opportunities

Lethbridge ED Coverage

Lethbridge continues to have significant coverage gaps. The following urgent gaps are currently open for coverage of mid-day shifts (11:00-19:00) :July 11, 13, 15, 27, 30, 31 and August 16.

In addition to those more critical coverage days, there is the option to pick up a 5 hour evening surge shift (19H-midnight) on most days in both July and August.

Lethbridge ED sees 140 to 180 patients daily, with 8-hour physician shifts covering an average of 20 to 30 patients per shift. Depending on the time of day, there are 1 to 3 physicians on duty. We operate as a full-scope ED, managing both adult and pediatric patients, and are designated as a Level 3 trauma center. The department is staffed by a mix of CCFP-EM and FRCP-EM trained physicians and functions as a regional referral destination, providing comprehensive emergency care to a broad catchment area

Trauma Coverage Gaps

The Department of Surgery continues to be challenged with many gaps in Tier 1 coverage for Trauma.

This month most of the gaps are filled in by AP's (taking over time) or resident extenders. However, they are currently left **with 1 gap in Block 1 for Monday July 14 1700-0800**. The Zone has approved the following funding structure: Emergency Physicians at \$288 per hour or resident extenders \$190 per hour.
