Speaker 1: Dr. Shaila Gunn

Title: Reducing carbon footprints: an everyday guide to environmental stewardship in the ED **Description**: Climate change impacts the health of our patients and puts additional stress on emergency departments.

The paradox is that every action we perform in the emergency department has a carbon footprint, contributing to perpetuating the cycle.

Building on a previous talk about strategies to consider at the departmental level, we will discuss the carbon footprint of emergency medicine, simple changes to reduce it, and how to advocate for low carbon health care.

Bio: Dr Past Issues. I would like to remind the department of the Guide to Agitation in older ER Patients and the ABCDs of Agitation. Ensuring care needs are met, is the patient in pain, or having urinary retention?

- The ABCDs of Agitation in Older ED Patients

Certain BPSD symptoms do not respond to pharmacological management, such as wandering, and are best managed with redirection. Pharmacologic therapy should be reserved for those patients who are a risk to themselves, the staff or refusing essential care. Start your dosing of pharmacologic management low, and go slow, as there is unpredictable absorption, and variable and delayed effects, try to minimize dose stacking.
