Patient Resource - Preventing Cervical Cancer

January is Cervical Health Awareness Month, a time to learn about how to prevent it or find it early.

AHS recommends cervical cancer screening once every three years, or as your healthcare provider recommends, for those between the ages of 25 and 69 who are at risk for cervical cancer and have been sexually active.
