

Sessional Instructor for initial practicum training and to help with increased student numbers due to the Saskatchewan Health Authority partnership

The department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine invites applications for a sessional instructor for the 2025 Fall semester to help with the surgical pathology practicum training and updating of course and curriculum content. This position includes, but is not limited to, the following responsibilities.

- Plan monthly schedule for students as they rotate through South Health Campus and Rockyview General Hospital and communicate it to them
- Organize the students learning activities for their rotations and ensure trainer coverage when not available
- communication with other trainers and pathologists as necessary
- Update and edit current surgical pathology practicum modules as needed
- Convert surgical pathology practicum modules into fillable pdf documents as needed
- Maintain and grade the GU exam
- Ensure that training modules including documentation of training module paperwork is being completed
- Review student and pathologist practicum training feedback with program director and address issues as needed
- Sit on U of C PA Program committees as needed

Qualifications:

- A Pathologists' Assistant Master degree from a NAACLS accredited institution and successful completion of the Pathologists' Assistant ASCP Board of Certification exam and/or the Canadian Council of Pathologists' Assistants (CCCAP-CCCPA) certification exam
- Minimum five years, full time experience as a practicing Pathologists' Assistant and experience with GU pathology preferred
- Experience in creating GU pathology educational material
- Previous experience training pathologists' assistant students in grossing
- Maintain active certification with ASCP and/or CCCPA-CCCAP
