

Sessional Instructor for University of Calgary Medical Science 745 Human Histology (MDSC 745)

The department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine invites applications for a sessional instructor(s) to teach Medical Science 745 Human Histology (MDSC 745) for the University of Calgary Pathologists' Assistant graduate program (MPATH). MDSC 745 is a Winter Semester 3 credit course beginning in the Winter Term (January 6th) and ending April 30th, 2025. The course covers the principles of basic histology technique, histology of basic tissue types and human organ systems. The course also includes a hands on component covering the macroscopic appearance and anatomy of human organ systems from the perspective of surgical specimens.

Preparing the Introduction to Grossing and Autopsy Course for the MPATH Program

The department of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine invites applications for a sessional instructor for the 2025 Winter semester to teach the introduction to grossing and autopsy course (MDSC 751.43) for the University of Calgary Pathologists' Assistant graduate program. MDSC 751.43 is a Winter Semester 3 credit course beginning in the Winter Term (January 6th) and ending April 30th, 2025. The course is an introduction to basic principles of the Pathologists' Assistant profession, designed to strategically facilitate the transition from the didactic lessons delivered in the first year of classes to the practical aspects applied in the second year. Immersed in interdisciplinary laboratory environments, students will be acquainted with various concepts affiliated with surgical pathology and autopsy services. Under the direct supervision of trained Pathologists' Assistants, students will be exposed to the daily workflow in the surgical pathology service, as they are introduced to basic human tissue dissection, description, and sampling techniques. An emphasis will be placed on the collaborative efforts from all healthcare personnel involved in the pre-analytic, analytic, and post-analytic gross room functions in terms of providing patient care through laboratory specimen management.
