

Fellowship Training – Second Round Applications

The Department of Pathology & Laboratory Medicine (DPLM), University of Calgary (U of C), and Alberta Precision Laboratories (APL) are offering 12-month comprehensive training, with a start date of **July 1, 2027** in the following programs:

Cytopathology Area of Focused Competence (AFC)

**Dermatopathology
Head and Neck Pathology
Molecular Genetic Pathology
Pediatric and Perinatal Pathology
Pulmonary Pathology
Renal/Transplantation Pathology
Uropathology/GU**

The DPLM and APL serve a population of ~1.5 million people through an integrated “regionalized” medical laboratory system based at four acute-care hospitals as well as at a modern state-of-the-art community-based central laboratory facility. APL accessions 120,000 surgical specimens, 245,000 gynecologic cytology specimens, and 10,000 non-gynecologic cytology specimens annually. The DPLM is part of Cumming School of Medicine (CSM), which provides excellent, and constantly updated, research infrastructure. Training is both didactic and preceptor based. Trainees will be expected to participate in research and education.

Prerequisites:

- Eligibility for educational [licensure](#) in the Province of Alberta
- Certification (or pending certification) in Diagnostic and Molecular Pathology (formerly Anatomical Pathology) or Diagnostic and Clinical Pathology (formerly General Pathology) by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada OR Certification in AP or AP/CP by the American Board of Pathology or equivalents
- Is legally allowed to work in Canada
- Eligible to obtain [Canadian Medical Protective Insurance](#) (CMPA)
