KEYNOTES & WORKSHOPS

Rose Hatala MSc, MD, FRCPC Professor, Department of Medicine Director, CHES Clinical Educator Fellowship University of British Columbia



Keynote: Educator? Assessor? Bridging the divide.

No matter our educational role (clinical supervisor, graduate student supervisor, resident or student), the formal educational systems surrounding us demand a significant contribution of our time and energy focussed on learner assessment. Does this focus on assessment improve our educational endeavours? In this symposium, we will explore how we navigate the divide between the educators (or learners) we wish to be and the assessment demands of the systems in which we work.

Workshop: Contemporary perspectives on assessment

In this workshop, we will explore contemporary validity frameworks for assessment as well as considering how philosophical positions influence our assessment endeavours. Participants are encouraged to bring assessment ideas/topics/tools that they wish to develop further, and we will work through these during the workshop.

Keynote: The New War in Medical Education

War and military metaphors have long been used in clinical medicine to describe the profession's collective fight against disease. However, recently medical trainees have adopted these metaphors for their own purposes to signal their intentions to restructure medical education. This talk describes the metaphoric language trainees use to describe the contours of this new war.

Workshop: Winning the War: Faculty as Key Personnel

As medical trainees engage in ongoing acts of professional resistance to reshape medical education, faculty play a key role in this fight. In this workshop, audience members will learn about the role faculty play, the boundaries they will not cross, and the tactics they provide to trainees. Participants will develop a new understanding of themselves in relation to trainees, the role they wish to play, and how best to support this collective effort.
