OHMES is pleased to feature Rahim Kachra, a clinician-educator in the Department of Medicine, Division of General Internal Medicine, and a practicing General Internist at the Foothills Medical Centre.

Rahim gravitated towards medical education as a medical student at the University of Calgary, as a number of his mentors were actively involved in this space. He was subsequently inspired to pursue novel approaches to the delivery of education and patient care, and after completing his fellowship in General Internal Medicine, he completed a Master of Education in Technology, Innovation, and Education at Harvard University.

Since returning to Calgary, Rahim has been a co-creator of the Calgary Interprofessional Challenge, a University-wide weekend event centered around a health-related theme and aimed at expanding the breadth of interprofessional medical education to students in all faculties. What started as a pilot in 2016 with 6 faculties, has now expanded to 10 faculties with the support of a number of Deans and former University Chancellor, Robert Thirsk. This has been presented in a number of venues both locally and internationally, and there is an appetite for scaling this program both within Calgary and provincially.

Rahim is also spearheading the Re-Imagining Medical Education (RIME) project, as Director of Teaching Innovation for the UME program at the Cumming School of Medicine. This project is a two-year plan aimed at understanding and potentially refining the way pre-clerkship medical education is delivered at CSM. With the support of an excellent team of students, educators, researchers, and brilliant minds, RIME aspires to create an unparalleled teaching and learning experience for our students.

Rahim also has a number of other educational roles in Calgary, including Director of the Internal Medicine Clerkship, and is Co-Chair of the annual Rocky Mountain Internal Medicine conference. In his spare time, he enjoys watching the world's most interesting hockey team, the Edmonton Oilers (we'll let that one go...).

OHMES will welcome Rahim and his interprofessional partner in crime, Nishan Sharma, to the 2019 Health & Medical Education Scholarship Symposium, where they will be co-facilitating a workshop based on the Interprofessional Challenge. Rahim will also be presenting his poster from AMEE 2018 - *A novel approach to true interprofessional medical education in undergraduate medicine.* We look forward to seeing more innovations from Rahim in the future!





2019 Health & Medical Education Scholarship Symposium
