# In our Community: Dr. Kent Hecker

Congratulations to Dr. Kent Hecker, PhD, member of the OHMES Executive Committee, and recipient of the Canadian Foundation for Innovation's John R. Evans Leaders Fund (JELF) in 2017. The JELF supports the pursuit of ground-breaking research in world-class facilities, and Dr. Hecker received the award to create his Health Education Neuroassessment Laboratory (THENaL).

THENal is a state of the art research facility where Dr. Hecker will elucidate how brain data relates to behavioral test performance data in the context of health professional education. To accomplish this, Dr. Hecker with a multi-disciplinary team of neuroscientists and health professionals will systematically study the neural signatures that underlie health professional expertise and quantitatively measure how best to assess these processes within the health professions. We congratulate Dr. Hecker and his team on the award, and look forward to the future achievements of the lab and its contributions to health education!

Medical Education Specialization Journal Club


### Mondays from September through May, 12:00-1:00pm, Rose Room, 3rd floor, TRW
