Facility access

- The University of Calgary is planning for increased facility access restrictions, and is collecting
 information to help identify faculty and staff who will continue to require access to UCalgary
 facilities.
- The Office of the Vice-President (Research) is co-ordinating this process for critical research activities. If you're participating in that process, you're **not required** to participate in this one.
- If you have not been included in the VPR's process, are in a role that's considered to be a critical function and will need access to onsite facilities, place visit cumming.ucalgary.ca/access and complete the building access form.

Learning and working

- Clinically trained, geographic full-time (GFT) faculty members are being asked to contribute to front-line clinical efforts. Your contribution is needed, and much appreciated. Schedules will be co-ordinated through your department head and Zone Emergency Operations Centre. Thank you!
- Our Distribution Services team continues to send and receive mail as per usual with one exception. If you work in a lab space, please pick your mail up from Distribution Services between the hours of 1 and 3 p.m.
- If you need to check fax machines for incoming clinical correspondence, please develop a schedule within your group to ensure this is checked regularly.
- On Mar. 23, UCalgary announced the suspension of parking permit payroll deductions for faculty and staff. The Cumming School of Medicine (CSM) is working closely with Alberta Health Services (AHS) to clarify what will happen for those who park in AHS-owned parking facilities. I'll share more information on this when it becomes available.

Education

- Classes for all education programs Bachelor of Community Rehabilitation, Bachelor of Health Sciences, Undergraduate Medical Education and Graduate Science Education (GSE) — are being offered remotely.
