

HSOC 301 Graduate Teaching Assistant (TA) Position Available - Fall 2024

A graduate student is needed for a full-time (204 hours) GAT position for **HSOC 301: Determinants of Health**. This undergraduate course is designed to foster exploration and understanding of the factors that influence the health of populations including its inequitable distribution.

The successful applicant will be mature, responsible and reliable; in their 2nd year or higher of their Masters or PhD program; and with a specialization in Population and Public Health. This position requires a graduate student with a strong grasp of population and public health (letter grade of A in MDCH 680: Foundations of Population and Health) and who enjoys interfacing with undergraduate students.

The role of the GAT will be to support Dr. Lindsay McLaren in all aspects of HSOC 301 including:

- attending all class sessions on Tuesdays and Thursdays 3:00-4:15 pm
- managing submissions of assignments on D2L
- general and timely communication with students (class emails, follow-up with submissions, etc.) and the instructor
- providing timely grading support for multiple assignments
- assisting with facilitation of in-class small group activities and discussions, as needed
- if the GAT desires, there is an opportunity to deliver a lecture or class session
