The University of Calgary Research Grants Committee (URGC) invites applications for the following seed funding opportunities.

- **University of Calgary SSHRC Explore Faculty Seed Grants:** This competition is open to applicants whose research falls within the domains of SSHRC. SSHRC Explore Faculty Seed Grants are designed to aid individual researchers and leaders of research teams in the development of applications for external funding. Applicants may request a **maximum of \$15,000 for 18 months**. For program guidelines, submission process, and

- **University of Calgary SSHRC Exchange Partnership Seed Grants (Development Stream):** This program provides support for the development of partnership arrangements and research activities that will be suitable for future SSHRC Partnership Development Grant or SSHRC Partnership Grant funding opportunities. Applicants may request a **maximum of \$10,000 for 12 months**. - **University of Calgary SSHRC Exchange Partnership Seed Grants (Engage Stream):** This program provides support for the development of partnership arrangements and research activities that will be suitable for future SSHRC Partnership Engage Grant funding opportunity. Applicants may request a **maximum of \$2,500 for 6 months**. **Open-call competition (rolling deadline): applications are accepted at any time and will be reviewed periodically (coinciding with other review intakes when possible).**

[CIHR Team Grant : Indigenous Gender and Wellness Team Grant](#)

This funding opportunity is the third phase of a larger initiative on the topic of [Indigenous Gender and Wellness](#). This third and final phase will provide funding for Indigenous-led teams to implement their ideas through research and action-oriented, community-based participatory projects that will improve wellness for Indigenous Peoples from a gendered perspective. Registration is required and must be submitted by **June 22, 2021**. Research Services final internal deadline for the full application is **noon on July 27, 2021**. [CIHR Team Grant : Diabetes Prevention and Treatment in Indigenous Communities: Resilience and Wellness](#)

The Team Grants in Diabetes Prevention and Treatment in Indigenous Communities: Resilience and Wellness will support Indigenous-led and community-driven research that aims to reverse the upward trajectory of diabetes and associated co-morbidities (e.g. cardiometabolic disease) among First Nations, Inuit and Métis Peoples and their communities. The objective of this component is to define and integrate models of resilience and wellness into diabetes prevention and treatment approaches among First Nations, Inuit and Métis Peoples. Research Services' final internal deadline for the Letters of Intent

phase is **noon** on **May 22, 2021**. Research Services final internal deadline for the full application is **noon** on **July 5, 2021**. Please note that this competition will run through the **[Research Management System](#)**.

The following opportunities are upcoming from CIHR:

Pre-Announcement: Operating Grant: HIV/AIDS and STBBI Community-Based Research

The objectives of the Operating Grant: HIV/AIDS and STBBI (Sexually transmitted and blood-borne infection) Community-Based Research grant are to:

- promote the creation of new knowledge that is relevant to communities affected by HIV and other STBBI in Canada;
- promote the dissemination of new knowledge and uptake of evidence into action to enhance the community response to the HIV epidemic and other STBBI;
- develop partnerships between researchers and affected communities;
- build capacity in the knowledge user community to engage in research and use evidence in their everyday business;
- build the next generation of HIV/AIDS and other STBBI CBR researchers through meaningful engagement of trainees in high quality CBR projects; and
- reduce the incidence of new HIV infections and/or other STBBI in high-risk groups by focusing research on prevention efforts.

Funds Available

The total amount available for this funding opportunity is \$1,800,000, enough to fund approximately four grants.

Pre-announcement of 13th JPIAMR Call - One Health interventions to prevent or reduce the development and transmission of AMR

The call advocates for a One Health approach to understand the impact of interventions on the development and transmission of antibiotic resistance and to design, implement, evaluate, and compare interventions that will have a true impact on preventing or reducing the development and transmission of antibiotic resistance in and between the different One Health settings (human, animal, environment).

The call will support research projects that also have the potential for impact in areas where the risk and burden of Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR) is greatest, such as in low and middle income countries in Asia and Africa.

The call opens early 2021.
