

The title of his lecture was "What a Long Strange Trip it's Been" - regenerative medicine approaches to lung and airway disease. Dr. Alison Laws – Best Overall Research – "Intra-operative margin assessment in breast-conserving surgery: A population-level comparison of techniques."

Dr. Arezoo Astanehe – Honourable Mention, Overall Research – "An enhanced recovery after surgery pathway for autologous breast reconstruction decreases postoperative pain, nausea, and length of hospital stay."



Dr. Sarah Lai – Best Poster – "Medium chain triglycerides are more potent than long chain triglycerides in inducing jejunal adaptation after massive ileocecal resection in rats."
