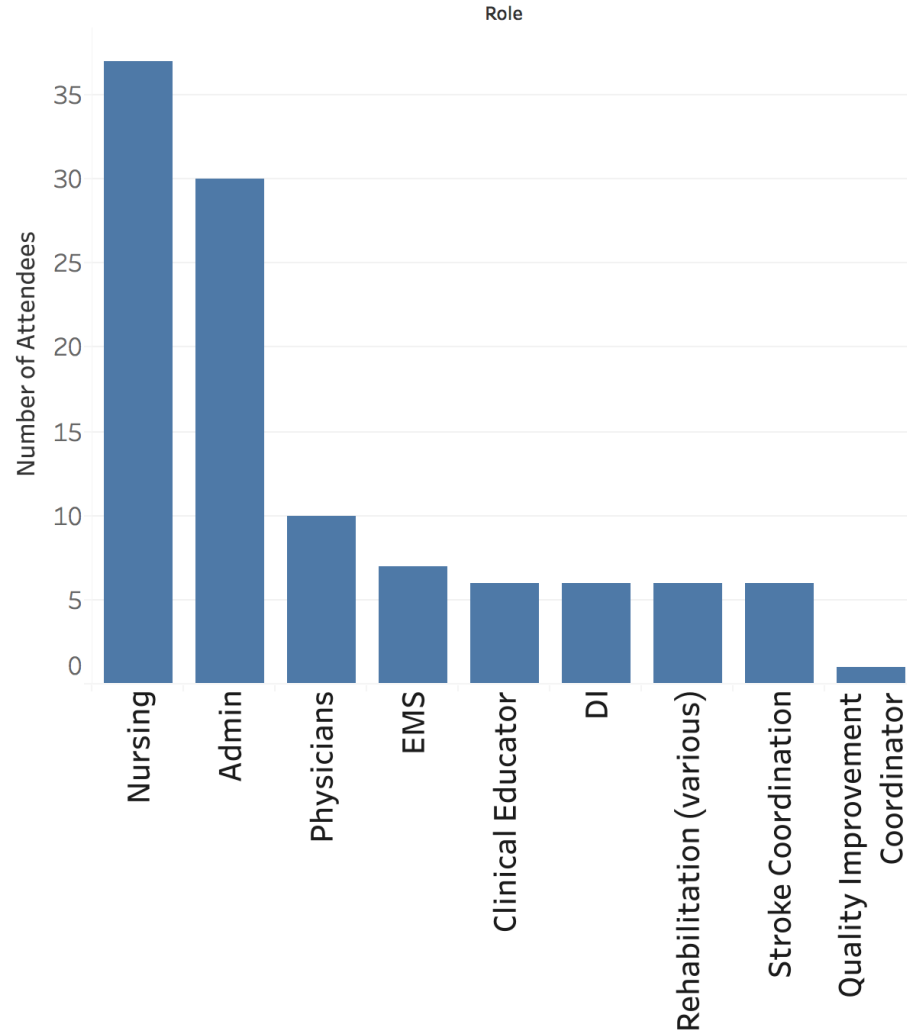
Learning Objectives

4. Reduce door-in-door-out time at your primary stroke centre for quick transport to the Comprehensive Stroke Centre for endovascular therapy

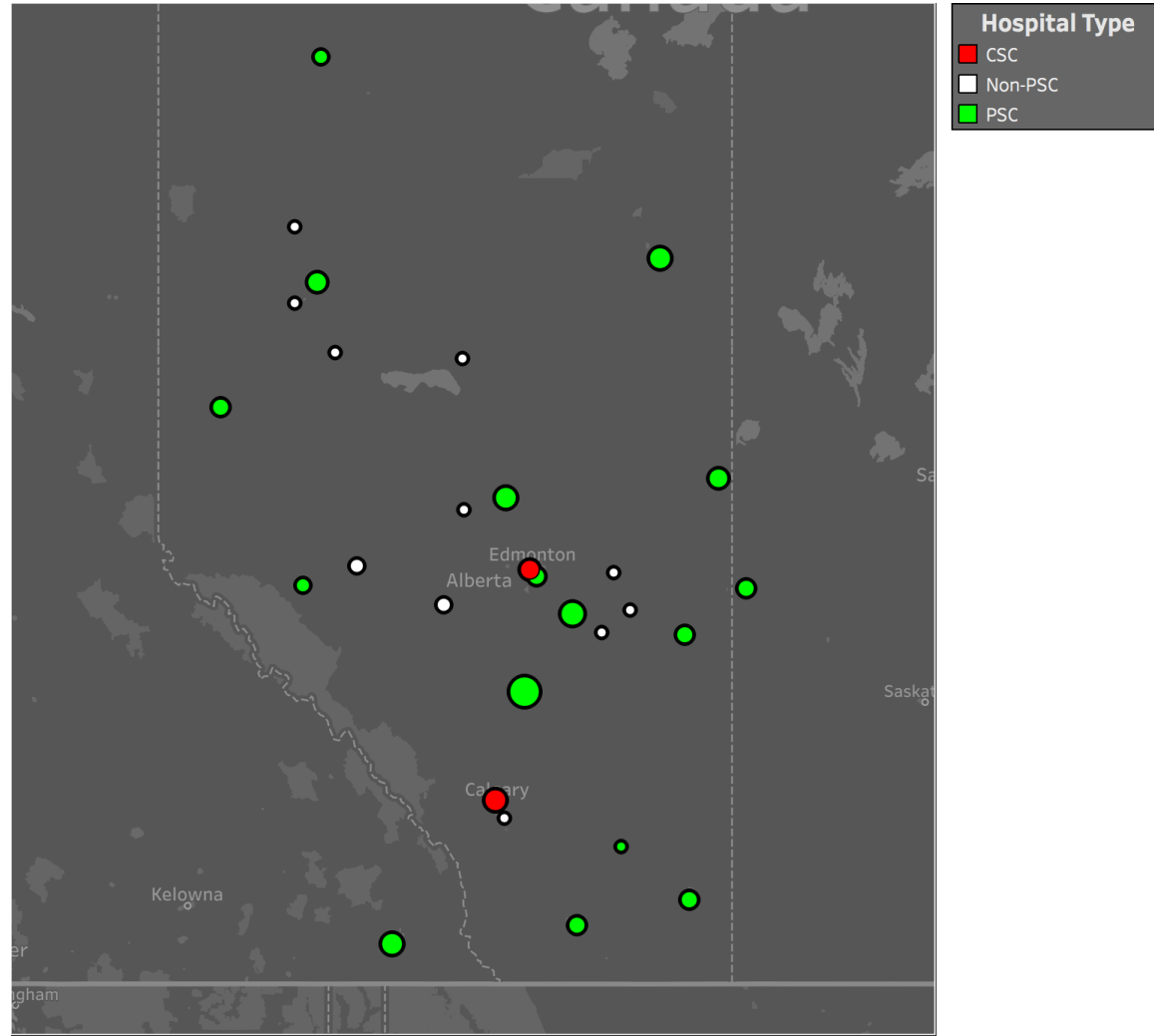
Who is here?
