



20+ Non Primary Stroke Centres

Acute stroke arrival Non Primary Stroke Centres:

- Rapid recognition of signs of stroke F.A.S.T
- Refer to <u>Stroke package:</u>
 - 1. Acute stroke /TIA algorithm provides direction for patient management.
 - 2. Acute stroke screen determines severity of stroke and potential eligibility for EVT.
 - 3. Suspected Stroke Orders outlines specific treatment needs- Labs, IV's, NPO.
- Rapid transport to the appropriate facility PSC or CSC
