

University of Calgary Vascular and Endovascular Surgery Fellowship

The Division of Vascular Surgery in conjunction with the support from the University of Calgary's Department of Surgery and Cumming School of Medicine are pleased to offer a 1 year fellowship in Vascular and Endovascular Surgery. The fellowship will focus on complex aortoiliac reconstructions utilizing contemporary open and endovascular techniques for both aneurysmal and occlusive disease.

The fellow will also be exposed to a large breadth of infrainguinal vascular procedures, and carotid interventions, including supra-aortic extra-anatomic debranching procedures with conjoint endovascular arch reconstructions. They will also have exposure to open thoracoabdominal aneurysm repair.

The University of Calgary's Vascular Surgery division is responsible for the vascular care of 2.5 – 3 million people in southwestern Saskatchewan, southeastern British Columbia, and the entirety of Southern Alberta. Major vascular case volumes are approximately 1000 cases per year.

Interested applicants are welcome to apply if they have completed a 5 year Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada accredited vascular surgery residency. Applicants should submit 3 letters of reference, curriculum vitae, and a letter outlining their expression of interest to the program director, Dr. Kenton Rommens and division chief, Dr. Gregory Samis.
