The successful applicant will join the HPB Teaching Service at the Foothills Medical Centre, providing comprehensive care for benign and malignant hepato-pancreato-biliary conditions. This is a **1.0 FTE** position, comprised of **80% clinical activity, 10% educational duties, 5% research, and 5% administrative responsibilities**. Remuneration is through Fee-for-Service. Experience in minimally invasive surgery is considered an asset. Hospital privileges will be granted within the Calgary Corridor.

Key Responsibilities:

- Provide on-call coverage according to Section of General Surgery and AHS policies, including corridor-wide HPB call and general surgery call at the South Health Campus.
- Participate in educational activities with medical students, residents, and fellows across undergraduate and postgraduate programs.
- Participate in administrative functions within the Section of General Surgery and Department of Surgery
- Contribute to collaborative research initiatives.

Calgary Highlights:

Calgary is approximately 80km east of the Canadian Rockies and is located in the transition zone between the Rocky Mountain Foothills and the Canadian prairies. It is the largest city in Alberta, with a metropolitan population of 1,239,220 people (Statistics Canada, 2016). The city is large in physical area, consisting of an inner city surrounded by suburban communities of various densities.

Calgary's climate is greatly influenced by the city's elevation and proximity to the Rocky Mountains. Calgary's winters are broken up by warm, dry Chinook winds that routinely blow into the city from over the mountains during the winter months.

Calgary has a vibrant theatre, art, food, sports and music community. It was designated as one of the cultural capitals of Canada in 2012. The city features an eclectic mix of restaurants and bars, cultural venues, public squares and shopping.
