And if you're not in a hurry, then do supportive things...be calm, give the person space, move things out of the way so no one gets hurt, help the person get what they need to feel better...in other words look out for people without making much fuss. A better Calgary hinges on creating more space for difference not just in our environments, but in our minds."
