

### **New AUPE Collective Agreement**

### Key components of the new collective agreement:

- Salary increases:
  - January 1, 2023 1.25%
  - September 1, 2023 1.5% (with a potential additional 0.5% increase if Alberta Real GDP is forecast to be at or above 2.7% in or around February 2024)
- 100% employer paid extended health and dental premiums
- New LOU's on Employment Security and Hybrid Work arrangements
- Improved seniority rights when bridging consecutive Fixedterm appointments
