Attached is a summary of the criteria used by the MDCH Admissions Review Committee to evaluate applicants. Please be reminded that the Review Committee can only consider information provided within the application package to make recommendations for admission. Also, while all applications (MSc and PhD) must include details around funding, funding is <u>required</u> for ALL incoming September 2019 PhD students. If prospective supervisors are uncertain about their ability to provide financial support and believe the candidate should be considered for our program, please ensure discussions are with the GPD have taken place PRIOR to December 14th, 2018.
