I contrast this with ideas that Calgary should do more to 'accommodate special needs' because I dislike the after the fact sound of the word accommodate. An inclusive Calgary is about awareness and comfort with difference and while we're getting comfortable with people's use of wheelchairs, we have further to go in becoming comfortable with people's behavioral differences. Such comfort boils down to the common sense of our shared humanity and might look like this: if you see someone in public who is over stimulated and acting out and you're in a hurry, keep moving without staring and without acting shocked. Moreover, put your damn phone away because the YouTube world does not need to see someone acting out as an event in your day. And if you're not in a hurry, then do supportive things...be calm, give the person space, move things out of the way so no one gets hurt, help the person get what they need to feel better...in other words look out for people without making much fuss. A better Calgary hinges on creating more space for difference not just in our environments, but in our minds."
